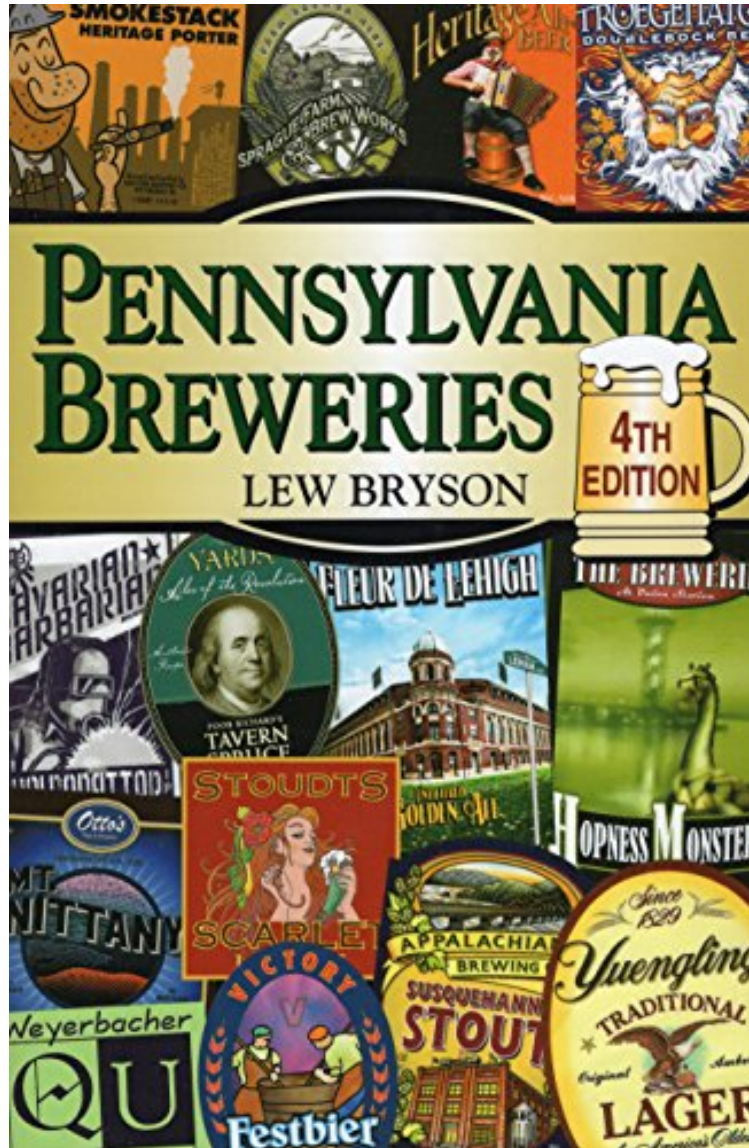

Lew Bryson's beer-writing style is purposeful and succinct with a deep passion and humor for the subject..its great for short attention spans, he only spends one page or less per business, organized by region [sections of Pennsylvania]. Despite a familiarity and history with a lot of the folks he encounters writing this book [a close knit beer industry in Pennsylvania], he spends a lot of time interviewing in order to provide new fresh stories and details [updates] regarding each individual business.
