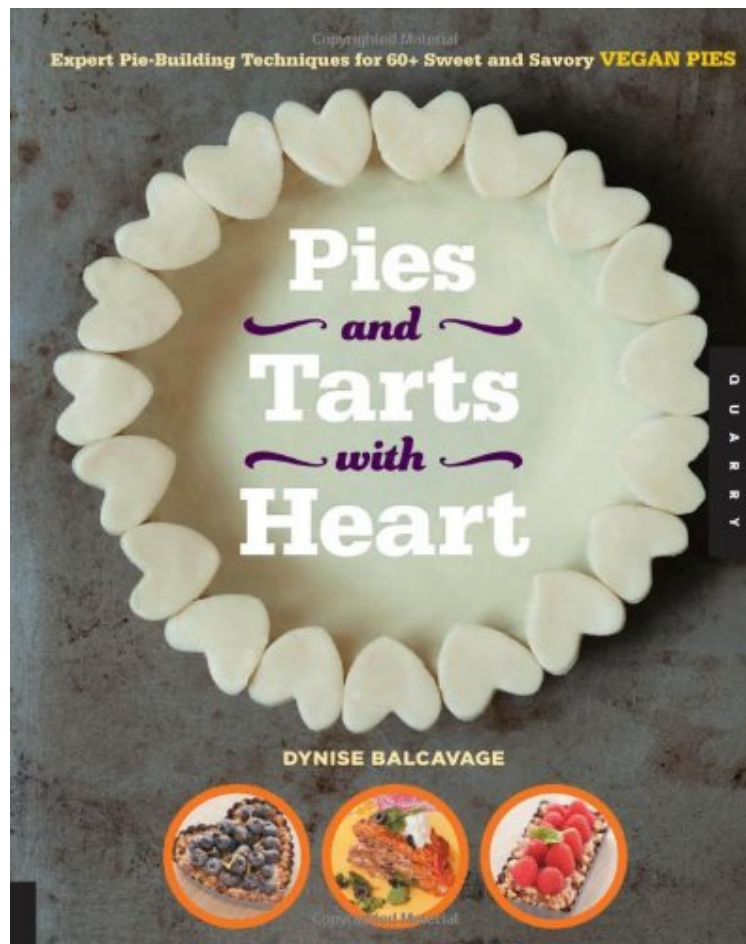

After months of waiting, (I literally ordered it about six months in advance,) it's finally here, and I'm so excited to be the first to review it. It features classic, fruit, nut, and cream pies, as well as chapters for savory pies, and pie wannabes, like Boston cream pie and whoopie pies. I also own Vegan Pie in the Sky by Isa Chandra Moskowitz, and this is just as good. I wouldn't recommend it to anyone who is trying to limit their soy consumption

however, as a lot of the recipes use tofu or soy based dairy substitutes. (Also a complaint of Moskowitz's book by other reviewers was the use of nuts for cream-based pies, this book does not rely on nuts.) There are also lots of beautiful pictures. Dynise Balcavage writes awesome vegan cookbooks and this one is no exception. In addition to having great recipes and clear instructions, it's also beautiful, with pretty pictures of virtually every recipe. Here are some of the recipes that I tried:

- Basic Single-Crust Pastry – Good basic pie crust with an excellent flavor
- Nutty Crust – Delicious nut-based crust Excellent with pumpkin pie
- Shoo-Fly Pie – This is a regional Pennsylvania pie, based on molasses, that I had never tried before. It is good – but super-sweet!
- Pumpkin Pie – This didn't completely set for me (which might have been baker error), but the flavor was excellent
- Butterscotch Pudding Pie – This pie was delectable – the filling is soooo good
- Lemon Bar Pie – One of my favorites in the book – the filling is lemony perfection
- Chocolate-Bourbon Pecan Pie – I'm not a huge pecan pie fan, but the addition of chocolate and bourbon makes this version incredible
- Easy Muffin Tin Pies – These are adorable and tasty! I made them for the holidays last year and they are a great addition to the table due to their visual appeal
- Easy Cheeseburger Pie – This is a dish that I had a lot growing up, now veganized! Classic comfort food
- Macaroni Pie – This is more like a casserole (which is why it is in the "Imposter Pie" chapter). It's how they do macaroni and cheese in Barbados and it is very, very good.
