It's wonderful.Overall, the first 200 pages are breads - muffins, crepes, popovers, loaves, waffles, pancakes, biscuits, and cakes. The last 75 pages are soups and stews. Many are staple recipes, like cornbread, but then there is cornmeal-wholewheat bread (wonderful), buttermilk kernel cornbread, and about 10 other

variations - can't wait to try Mexican cornbread! I find it an easy reference when trying to find a bread to go with a certain meal or when the bread is the meal!
