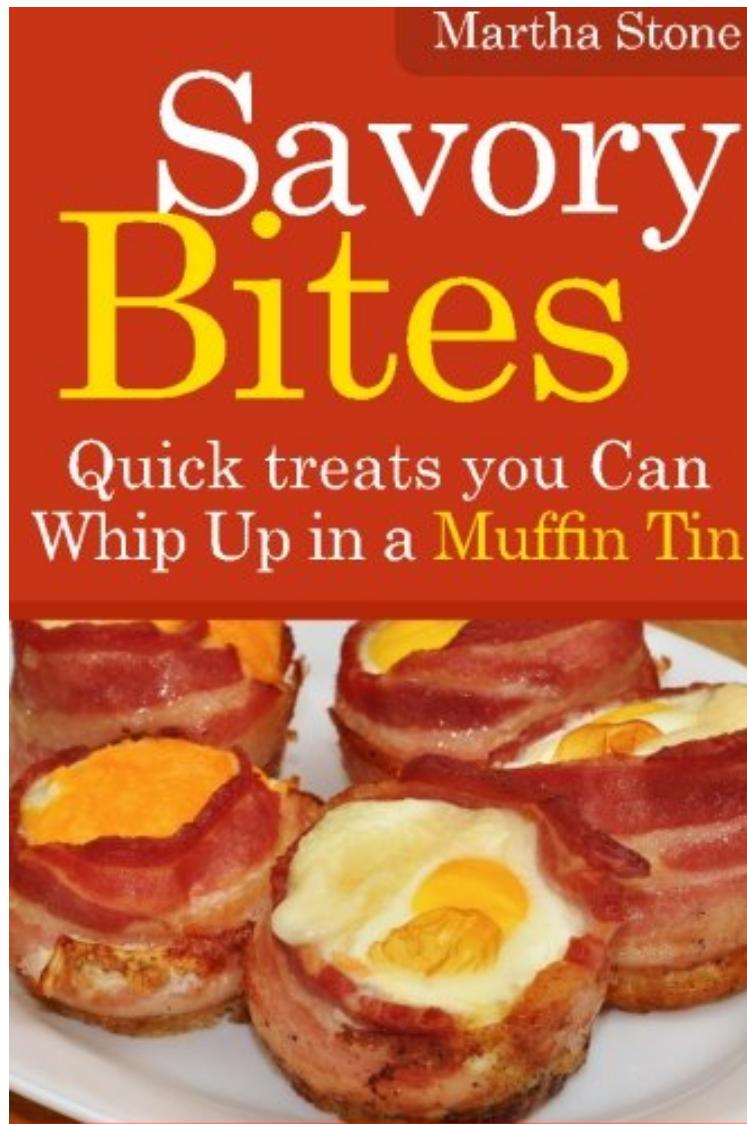

The recipes in the book sound good; however, the word use and sentence structure is so poorly written it's hard to understand what the author is saying. Perhaps this book was originally in another language and poorly translated to English or perhaps the author/editor has poor English grammar skills - I don't know, but the recipes are very hard to follow and the steps are often out of order (for example - step 4 is to take the finished product out of the oven to cool and step 5 is to put it into the oven to begin baking!). Since some of the recipes do sound appetizing, I'm going to do my best to interpret the instructions and make a few of the recipes. One thing is for fact - the word "quick" should NOT be in the title. There's no quick way to put logic to poor writing and many of the recipes have numerous steps and long baking times.

Cooking should be fun and easy. As such, not having a lot of time should never be an excuse to shy away from the kitchen. There are a variety of recipes you can try that are quick, easy and can be done in your muffin tin, so that you can get many servings made in one go. By the time you finish reading this book and trying all the recipes included, you will definitely become known as the 'tasty bite sized' chef.
