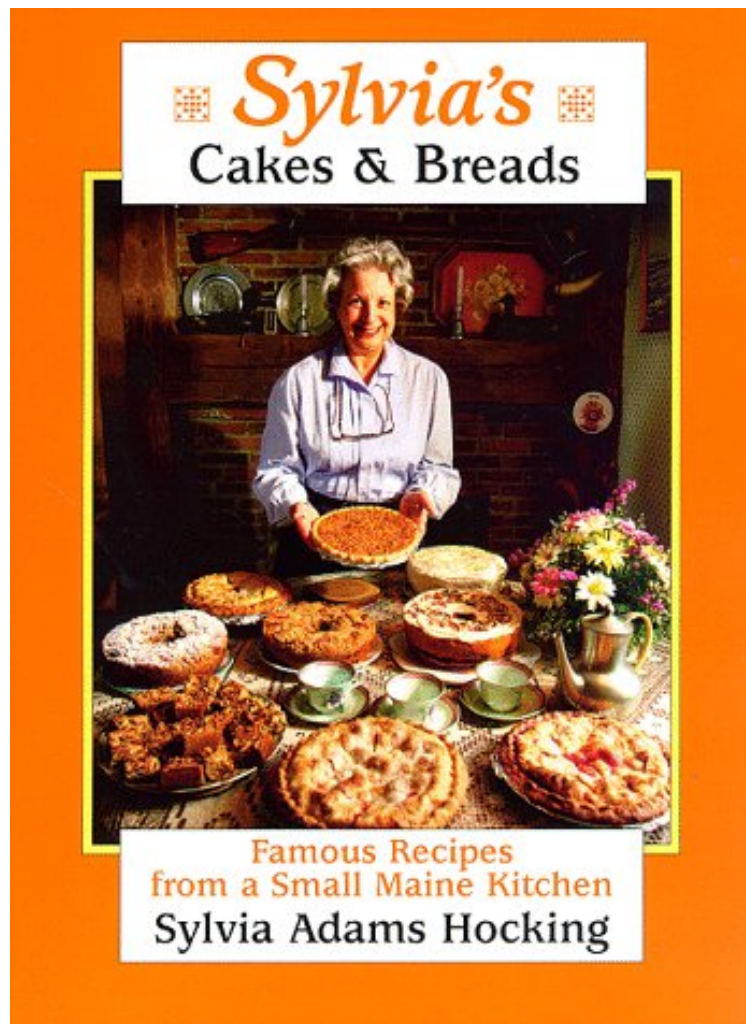

Sylvia's Cakes Breads by Sylvia Adams Hocking distills some 30 years of baking for celebrities, tourists, her family and townspeople in South Thomaston, Maine. The world literally beat a path to her kitchen door and the world that didn't make it to Maine ordered by mail. She started modestly, making her favorite breads, then gradually added her family's favorites, and by word of mouth the business grew. She retired recently and decided to publish her recipes, and any cook with an imagination and a rudimentary grasp of baking will be glad she did. These recipes cannot compete with the seductive creations in glossy magazines or opulent cookbooks. Fortunately, they don't have to. Each, depending on the category, will soothe the most jaded palate. Here, in a deceptively unassuming book are clearly written recipes for brownies, coffee cakes, cookies, breads and fruitcakes that use readily available ingredients. The nuts, chocolate, cream, butter, and eggs that dance through the pages may put off the calorie counters, but anyone who bakes Cranberry Sour Cream Coffee Cake or Chocolate Butter Pound Cake will rejoice in remembrance of things past.
